# Editorial: Silver Workers is progressing!

The winter period of implementation of the Silver Workers project have seen the successful delivery of the first analytic outcomes, necessary for the definition of the training objectives and the specific subjects to focus on in the educational material. On the base of a series of socio-political, occupational demographic researches partners' countries, five National Reports have been drafted. An interactive infographic was also from using data 385 prepared questionnaires distributed and collected in the same EU area. All these documents and analysis have been later processed to create a Policy Recommendation document.

Silver Workers project and its action in favour of 50+ unemployed persons in the EU

Nowadays in Europe the exigency to help 50+ workers to reshape their professional future while coping with possible working obsolescence is becoming day in day out more pressing.



The support to provide to "silver workers" (50s+ jobseekers, either unemployed and/or dismissed) focuses on their re-integration into the job market by giving them all intellectual and formative tools to convert their hobbies and other interests into start up's.

### What we have done so far

During Summer 2016, the project consortium concluded the phase of preliminary study and surveys to develop policy recommendations and provide the basis for the correspondence of project results to the real needs of the target group.

Socio-occupational and demographic snapshots have been utilised to analyse the situation in various National Reports, drafted by project partners through a desk research in Italy, Uk, Spain Belgium and Portugal.

Project partners analysed questionnaires administered to a sample of 385 Silver Workers in partner countries, and created an interactive infographic to share data in an easy way.





All this information collected through reports and questionnaires have been later summed up into a document of Policy Recommendations

## Silver Workers III Consortium Meeting in Badajoz

The third project's Consortium meeting took place in Badajoz, Spain on 18th – 19th November 2016 hosted by project partner Fundecyt PCTEX.

report, which showed an overall improvement of all indicators indicating a clear understanding of the objectives and mutual responsibilities for the implementation of project actions by all partners.

This first part of the meeting was followed by the presentation of the final version of the document "Structure of the training program", first deliverable of the Intellectual Output 2, by Staffordshire University. The presentation focused on the definition of learning outcomes that make up the program, and on procedures for defining an ECVET profile. Fundecyt then delivered a presentation on the main instruments for the realization of e-learning platform that will be one of the deliverables of Intellectual Output 2 and 3.

The meeting terminated with the description of the state of the art concerning all dissemination activities implemented and to perform in the next project period.

Eventually, dates and location of the IV Consortium meeting have been jointly decided: of Silver Workers partners will meet next in Stokes-on-Trent, UK on 3rd - 4th March 2017 hosted by Staffordshire University.

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
